Details of Indian Prime Ministers

1. Jawaharlal Nehru (1889–1964)

Jawaharlal Nehru was the **first prime minister** of Independent India. He was also one of the principal leaders of India's independence movement in the 1930s and '40s. He was the longest-serving PM of India.

2. Gulzarilal Nanda (1898-1998)

Gulzarilal Nandha was the first **Interim Prime Minister** of India. He is also the recipient of India's highest civilian honour Bharat Ratna (1997).

3. Lal Bahadur Shastri (1904–1966)

Lal Bahadur Shastri was an Indian politician and statesman who served as the **2nd Prime Minister** of India from 1964 to 1966 and the 6th Home Minister of India from 1961 to 1963.

4. Indira Gandhi (1917–1984)

Indira Gandhi was elected as the **third prime minister of India** in 1966 and was also the **first woman prime minister of India** and, to date, the only female prime minister of India.

5. Morarji Desai (1896–1995)

Morarji Ranchhodji Desai was an Indian independence activist and politician who served as the **4th Prime Minister of India** between 1977 to 1979 leading the government formed by the Janata Party.

6. Charan Singh (1902–1987)

Chaudhary Charan Singh served as the **5th Prime Minister of India** between 28 July 1979 to 14 January 1980. He is referred to as the "champion of India's peasants".

7. Rajiv Gandhi (1944–1991)

Rajiv Gandhi was an Indian politician who served as the **sixth prime minister of India** from 1984 to 1989. He took office at the age of 40 after the 1984 assassination of his mother. Rajiv Gandhi is the **youngest prime minister** of India.

8. V. P. Singh (1931–2008)

Vishwanath Pratap Singh shortened to V. P. Singh, was an Indian politician who was the **7th Prime Minister of India** from 1989 to 1990 and the 41st Raja Bahadur of Manda.



9. Chandra Shekhar (1927-2007)

Chandra Shekhar Singh was an Indian politician who served as the **8th Prime Minister of India**, between 10 November 1990 and 21 June 1991.

10. P. V. Narasimha Rao (1921-2004)

Pamulaparthi Venkata Narasimha Rao was an Indian lawyer and politician who served as the **9th Prime Minister of India** from 1991 to 1996. He is often referred to as the "Father of Indian Economic Reforms".

11. Atal Bihari Vajpayee (1924- 2018)

The **10th prime minister of India** is Atal Bihari Vajpayee. Vajpayee was one of the co-founders and a senior leader of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP).

12. H. D. Deve Gowda (Born 1933)

Haradanahalli Doddegowda Deve Gowda is an Indian politician from the state of Karnataka. He served as the 11th prime minister of India from 1 June 1996 to 21 April 1997.

13. Inder Kumar Gujral (1919 - 2012)

Inder Kumar Gujral was an Indian diplomat, politician, and freedom activist who served as the **12th prime** minister of India from April 1997 to March 1998.

14. Manmohan Singh (1932 - 2024)

Manmohan Singh is an Indian politician, economist, and statesman who has been the **13th prime minister of India** from 2004 to 2014. He is the third longest-serving prime minister of India.

15. Narendra Modi (Born 1950)

Narendra Damodardas Modi is an Indian politician serving as the **14th prime minister of India** and the **current prime minister** of India since 2014. Shri Narendra Modi was sworn in as India's Prime Minister on 30th May 2019, marking the start of his second term in office. The first ever Prime Minister to be born after Independence.
