DRDO Celebrates 64th Foundation Day on 1st January 2022

- Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) celebrated 64th DRDO Day on January 1, 2022.
- The DRDO was formed in 1958 from the amalgamation of the then already functioning Technical Development Establishment (TDEs) of the Indian Army and the Directorate of Technical Development & Production (DTDP) with the Defence Science Organisation (DSO).
- Over 175 transfers of technologies happened in 2021.
- Now DRDO is working rigorously to achieve hypersonic systems and also working on the fifthgeneration advanced combat aircraft.

- It was formed in 1958 by the merger of the Technical Development Establishment and the
 Directorate of Technical Development and Production of the Indian Ordnance Factories with the

- DRDO is India's largest and most diverse research organisation.
- With a network of 52 laboratories, which are engaged in developing defence technologies covering various fields, like aeronautics, armaments, electronics, land combat engineering, life sciences, materials, missiles, and naval systems.

World Braille Day- Jan 4

- World Braille Day is an international day on 4 January and celebrates awareness of the
 importance of braille as a means of communication in the full realization of the human rights for
 blind and visually impaired people
- The day is marked remembering the birth anniversary of Louis Braille, the inventor of Braille for people with visual disabilities.
- Louis Braille was born on 4th January 1809 in the town of Coupvray in northern France.

 Braille is a tactile representation of alphabetic and numerical symbols using six dots to represent each letter and number, and even musical, mathematical and scientific symbols

World Day of War Orphans: January 6

- Every year on January 6, the World Day of War Orphans is recognized.
- The World Day of War Orphans 2022 reminds the world that caring for children in awful conditions is a duty, particularly in the face of a pandemic.
- Children who have been injured in a gunfight or separated from their families require particular care in order to heal the mental wounds of war, begin school, and restart normal life.
- World Day of War Orphans was started by the French organisation SOS Enfants en Detresses,
 which aimed to help children affected by conflict.
- According to the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), an orphan is defined as a "child under 18 years of age who has lost one or both parents to any cause of death".

17th Non-Resident Indian Day or Pravasi Bharatiya Diwas: January 9

- Pravasi Bharatiya Diwas (PBD) or Non-Resident Indian (NRI) Day is annually celebrated on 9th
 January to mark the contribution of the Overseas Indian community to the development of India.
- This is 17th edition of or Non-Resident Indian (NRI) Day.
- The 1st ever Pravasi Bharatiya Diwas was celebrated on 9 January 2003.
- On the occasion of 2022 Pravasi Bhartiya Divas (PBD), Union Minister of State for External Affairs V. Muraleedharan will speak at a virtual youth PBD conference on the "role of Indian diaspora" in innovation and new technology.

World Hindi Day- Jan 10:

- January 10 is celebrated as World Hindi Day every year to spread awareness about Hindi as an
 international language across the world.
- The day is especially observed by Indian embassies abroad.

- The day marks the anniversary of **the first World Hindi Conference** which was inaugurated on **January 10, 1975**, by the then prime minister Indira Gandhi.
- In the year 1975, the first-ever World Hindi Conference took place in Maharashtra's Nagpur on January 10.
- The conference was inaugurated by then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi and saw participation from a total of 30 countries.
- And in 2006, former Prime Minister Dr Manmohan Singh declared that January 10 will be observed as World Hindi Day every year.
- This was also the first time that the ministry of external affairs started celebrating the day abroad.

National Human Trafficking Awareness Day- Jan 11

- National Human Trafficking Awareness Day on January 11 raises awareness of the persistent issue of human trafficking.
- Though the entire month of January has already been recognized as National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month, this day is specifically dedicated to awareness and prevention of the illegal practice.
- This holiday is also separate from the World Day against Trafficking Persons, as established by the United Nations.
- Since the **Senate established this day of observance in 2007**, it has drawn massive public support from individual donations to government-organized events.
- In 2010, President Obama dedicated the entire month of January to awareness and prevention
 of human trafficking.
- There are over 50 established organizations that globally combat this illegal practice, and more awareness has been raised than ever before.

National Youth Day- 12th Jan:

National Youth Day is observed to honour the ideals and thoughts of Swamiji Vivekananda who
had tremendous faith in youth.

- In India, the National Youth Day is celebrated on 12 January annually to commemorate the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda.
- Vivekananda always highlighted the role of youth in the process of nation-building and inspired them to have a confident attitude.
- In 2022, we are observing the 159th birth anniversary of Swami Vivekanand (12 January 1863).
- The theme for National Youth Day 2022 is "It's all in the mind."
- The decision to celebrate Vivekananda's birthday as National Youth Day was taken in 1984, and it was first marked on January 12, 1985.
- The government had then said that the philosophy of Swamiji and the ideals for which he lived and worked "could be a great source of inspiration" for the Indian youth.

6th Armed Forces Veterans Day: January 14, 2022

- On January 14, 2022, India observed 6th Armed Forces Veterans Day to recognize the sacrifice of our veterans in serving the nation.
- In early it was called Armistice Day when initiated in 2017.
- It is observed as a mark of respect and recognition of the services rendered by Field Marshal KM
 Cariappa OBE, the first Indian Commander-in-Chief of the Indian Armed Forces who retired on 14
 January 1953.
- Key Facts: Last year, Admiral Karambir Singh released the 'Swarnim Vijay Varsh' song dedicated to our brave and courageous soldiers of the 1971 war.

Indian Army Day- Jan 15:

- Every year 15 January is observed as Indian Army Day because on this day in 1949 field
 Marshal Kodandera M Cariappa took over as the first Commander-in-Chief of the Indian Army
 from General Sir Francis Butcher, the last British Commander-in-Chief.
- This year marks the 74th Indian Army Day.
- The Indian Army is one of the most powerful militaries of the world, competing with superpowers like the US, Russia and China.
- The motto of the Indian Army is 'service before self' and its mission is to ensure national security

and national unity, defend the nation from external aggression and internal threats, and maintain peace and security within its borders.

- Salute to the brave soldiers, who risk and sacrifice their lives to protect us.
- Even the Prime Minister of India Lal Bahadur Shastri in 1965 had given the slogan like "Jai Jawan Jai Kisan".

17th National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) Raising Day: 19th January 2022

- National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) celebrates its Raising Day every year on January 19
 to mark the formation of NDRF, under the Ministry of Home Affairs on 19th January 2006.
- This year India celebrates 17th NDRF Raising Day.
- There are 12 NDRF battalions located in different parts of the country and comprises as many as
 13,000 NDRF personnel who work to build a safer country.

- The celebration is led by the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).
- The first-ever International Day of Education was celebrated on 24 January 2019 as per the
 resolution passed by the United Nations General Assembly on December 3rd 2018 to celebrate
 the role of education in development.

Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Birth Anniversary: Jan 23

- India is celebrating 125th Birth anniversary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose on January 23.
- Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose's birth anniversary is also marked as "Parakram Diwas" (Courage Day), Modi government had announced in 2021.
- In order to honour and remember Netaji's indomitable spirit and selfless service to the nation,
 the government decided to celebrate his birthday on the 23rd day of January every year as
 Parakram Diwas to inspire people of this country, especially the youth, to act with fortitude in the face of adversity as Netaji did and to infuse in them a spirit of patriotic favour.
- However, Trinamool Congress had announced to celebrate Bose's birth anniversary as 'Desh Nayak Diwas'.
- Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose was born on 23 January, 1897 in Cuttack, Orissa. He was one of the most prominent Indian freedom fighters.
- His army was known as Indian National Army (INA) or Azad Hind Fauj.
- He also led an Indian national force from abroad against the Western powers during World War
 II.

National Girl Child Day- Jan 24

- India is celebrating National Girl Child Day on January 24.
- National Girl Child Day is celebrated to raise awareness among people regarding inequalities, discrimination, exploitation faced by the girls in society.
- It is an initiative undertaken by the ministry of women and child development with an
 objective to provide support and opportunities to the girls of India.
- The day was observed for the first time in 2008 as an initiative by the Ministry of Women and Child Development and the Government of India.
- The day is in line with various campaigns and prgrammes of the Indian government including
 Beti Bachao Beti Padhao, and Save the Girl Child.

12th National Voters Day to be celebrated on January 25, 2022
