## Global Family Day: 1st January

- Global Family Day 2025 is observed on the 1st of January 2025.
- Every year, **Global Family Day, also known as World Peace Day,** is observed to encourage the idea of peace and unity in the world.
- On the first day of the new millennium, in 1997, the United Nations General Assembly declared the International Decade for the Culture of Peace and Nonviolence for the Children of the World.

## World Braille Day 2025 : 4th January

- World Braille Day is observed annually on January 4 to honour Louis Braille, the inventor of the Braille system, which has had a profound impact on the literacy, independence, and inclusivity of visually impaired individuals.
- This day highlights the significance of accessibility and inclusivity in society.
- Date Observed: January 4

First Observed: January 4, 2019

UN Recognition: Declared by the UNGA in November 2018

## World Day of War Orphans 2025: 6th January

- World Day of War Orphans 2025 is observed on the 6th January 2025.
- According to UNICEF, there were "almost 140 million orphans worldwide" as of 2015.

## World Hindi Day: 10th January

- World Hindi Day 2025 is observed on the 10th of January 2025.
- The inaugural World Hindi Conference, or Vishva Hindi Sammelan, was held in Nagpur, Maharashtra, in 1975, which is when World Hindi Day first became a thing.
- This day was dedicated to honoring both the Hindi language and the many authors who have contributed to its literature.

#### National Human Trafficking Awareness Day: 11th January

- National Human Trafficking Awareness Day 2025 is observed on the 11th January 2025.
- The fight against human trafficking made progress in the late 20th and early 21st centuries.
- The Trafficking Victims Protection Act, which was passed in 2000, was the first federal statute to address contemporary slavery.

#### National Youth Day: 12th January

• National Youth Day 2025 is observed on the 12th January 2025.



• On January 12, 1984, the Indian government declared Swami Vivekananda's birthday as National Youth Day for the first time.

## The Indian Army Day is commemorated each year on January 15<sup>th</sup>.

- Army Day is celebrated on 15 January every year in India, in recognition of Lieutenant General Kodandera M. Cariappa's (later who became Field Marshal) taking over as the first Commander-in-Chief of the Indian Army from General Francis Roy Bucher, the last British Commander-in-Chief of India, on 15 January 1949.
- The 77th Indian Army Day will be celebrated with a grand light and sound show in Pune, depicting the evolution of Indian warfare across different periods of history.

## National Startup Day in India is being observed on January 16, 2025

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi declared January 16 as National Startup Day in the year 2021.
- National Startup Day celebrates India's growing startup ecosystem and encourages entrepreneurship, innovation, and job creation.
- India is now the **third-largest startup ecosystem** globally.
- The number of DPIIT-recognised companies has grown from around 500 in 2016 to 1,59,157 as of January 15, 2025.
- The Startup India initiative, launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on January 15, 2016, marked the beginning of the Startup India Innovation Week.

#### Tripura, Manipur, and Meghalaya Foundation Day 2025 : 21st January

- Tripura, Manipur, and Meghalaya Foundation Day is observed on the 21st January.
- Two princely states, Manipur and Tripura, united with India in 1949.
- Later, they were given the status of a union territory. In **1972, Meghalaya and Tripura were** granted full sovereignty.
- The Mizo Accord was ratified in 1986, and Mizoram became a sovereign state in 1987. NEFA, or Arunachal Pradesh, received full statehood in 1987.

#### Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Jayanti: 23rd January

- Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Jayanti is observed on the 23rd of January 2025.
- In Cuttack, Orissa/Odisha, on January 23, 1897, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose was born.
- With the motto "Delhi Chalo," Netaji organized and oversaw a 5,000-man army known as the Azad Hind Fauj (Indian National Army) in Southeast Asia during World War II in 1942.
- To win over the people in his native Bengal, he also started a new political party called "the Forward Bloc."

#### International Day of Education: 24th January

- International Day of Education is observed on the 24th January 2025
- The UN General Assembly declared the International Day of Education in December 2018 as a way to honor education and to think about how crucial learning is to progress and peace.

#### National Girl Child Day: 24th January

- National Girl Child Day is observed on the 24th January 2025.
- The Ministry of Women and Child Development of the Government of India established National Girl Child Day in 2008, marking the beginning of the day's history.

## National Voters Day: 25th January

- National Voters Day is observed on the 25th of January.
- This Year's Theme "Nothing Like Voting, I Vote for Sure" is a continuation of last year's theme emphasizing the importance of participation in the electoral process, and encouraging voters to take pride in exercising their franchise.
- The Election Commission of India (ECI), which was established in 1950, was founded on January 25.
- In order to encourage young people to participate in the election process, this day was first observed in 2011.
- Let us inform you that while the voting age was once 21 years old, it was decreased to 18 years old in 1988.

#### National Tourism Day: 25th January

- National Tourism Day is observed on the 25th of January 2025.
- National Tourism Day has a long history dating back to the Indian government's proclamation of January 25 as Tourism Day in India.
- This day was created to highlight the value of travel and raise awareness of how vital it is to the economy of the nation.
- It is believed that the first National Tourism Day was celebrated in 1948.

## International Day Of Clean Energy: 26 January

- The International Day Of Clean Energy is celebrated every year on the 26th of January 2025.
- The United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) adopted the resolution A/RES/77/327 on 25 August 2023 and declared that the International Day of Clean Energy will be observed every year on 26th January.
- International Day of Clean Energy 2025 was declared by the United Nations General Assembly

International Holocaust Remembrance Day 2025: January 27

- International Holocaust Remembrance Day 2025 is observed every year on the 27th January.
- The UN General Assembly adopted resolution 60/7 on November 1, 2005, to designate January 27 as the International Holocaust Remembrance Day (IHRD).
- On January 27, 2006, the first commemoration of International Holocaust Remembrance Day was held at the UN Headquartered in New York City.
- After that UN Headquarters commemorates this day every year.

## World Leprosy Day: 26th January

- World Leprosy Day 2025 is observed on the last Sunday of January, i.e., 26th January 2025.
- The disease is also called Hansen's disease, named after the Norwegian doctor Gerhard Henrik Armauer Hansen, who is known for identifying the bacteria that causes Leprosy.
- French philanthropist Raoul Follereau started World Leprosy Day in 1954 to raise awareness of the illness, particularly its socioeconomic effects. World Leprosy Day is observed on the last Sunday of January.
- To honor Mahatma Gandhi's unwavering compassion for those suffering from the disease, the day is marked in India on January 26, the anniversary of his passing.

## International Customs Day: 26th January

- International Customs Day 2025 is observed on the 26th January 2025.
- The European Customs Union Study Group (E.C.U.S.G.) was established by the Committee for European Economic Cooperation in 1948 to investigate the feasibility of establishing one or more inter-European customs unions.
- To increase the effectiveness of customs administrations around the world, the Customs Cooperation Council (C.C.C.) was established in 1952.
- In 1983, the group established International Customs Day.

## Birth Anniversary of Lala Lajpat Rai: 28th January

• The birth Anniversary of Lala Lajpat Rai is observed on the 28th of January 2025.

#### Data Protection Day: January 28, 2025

• Data Protection Day, also known as Data Privacy Day, is celebrated annually on January 28.

- The World Health Assembly (WHA) recognized January 30 as the World Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTD) Day on 31st May 2021 through decision WHA74(18).
- After the decision WHA74(18), the WHO has joined the Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTD) community.

#### Martyrs Day: 30th January

- Martyrs Day 2025 is observed on the 30th of January 2025.
- Gandhi promoted nonviolent protests throughout India's struggle for independence and encouraged everyone to set an example.
- With the British, he negotiated several peace deals before issuing the ultimatum to leave. Gandhi
  undertook the nearly impossible task of creating a nation out of numerous provinces and territories
  as the Indian constitution was being ratified.
