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IMPORTANT DAYS**World Coconut Day: September 2**

- **World Coconut Day** is celebrated on **September 2** every year.
- The theme for World Coconut Day 2025 is “**Uncovering Coconut’s Power, Inspiring Global Action.**”
- In 1998, the **Asian and Pacific Coconut Community** declared World Coconut Day to bring awareness to the powerful nutrients and versatility of this superfood.

Skyscraper Day: September 3

- **Skyscraper Day** is celebrated on **September 3** every year.
- Skyscrapers Day is celebrated every year on September 3, on the birth anniversary of Louis H. Sullivan, often called the ‘father of modern skyscrapers.
- **The world’s first skyscraper came up in Chicago in 1885.**

National Teachers Day 2025: September 5

- In India, every year **5th of September is celebrated as National Teachers Day** to contribute to our teachers.
- Fifth September is the birth anniversary of Dr. Sarevepalli Radhakrishnan, the former president of India who was a well-known Teacher, Scholar, and Philosopher.
- In India, the President, Dr. Sarevepalli Radhakrishnan’s birthday is celebrated as Teacher’s Day. He was one of the greatest teachers and very popular among the students.

International Day of Charity 2024: September 5

- In 2012, the United Nations General Assembly declared the **International Day of Charity was observed on the 5th of September.**
- They declared September 5 as an International Day of Charity in order to remember the death anniversary of Mother Theresa who was awarded the Nobel Prize for Peace in 1979.
- On **17 December 2012**, the UN General Assembly declared the 5th of September as the International Day of Charity.

World Literacy Day: September 8

- **World Literacy Day or International Literacy Day** is observed each year on the **8th of September.**
- In 1966, UNESCO declared the 8th of September as World Literacy Day to remind the importance of literacy as a matter of dignity and human rights for people.

- This day was declared by **The United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organisation or UNESCO on 26th October 1966**

World Physical Therapy Day: September 8

- Every year **8th of September is observed as World Physical Therapy Day.**
- World Physical Therapy Day got **recognized by the World Confederation for Physical Therapy in the year of 1996.**
- Sweden's National Board of Health and Welfare granted physical therapists official registration in 1887.
- In India, **physiotherapy was first started in the year of 1952.**

World Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy Day: 7th September 2025

- **Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD), Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India** observes **World Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (DMD) Day** annually on 7th September.
- The theme for 2025 was **“Family: The Heart of Care.”**
- **Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (DMD)** is a rare, progressive disorder causing gradual muscle weakening, primarily affecting children, impacting mobility, breathing, and heart functions.

World Suicide Prevention Day: September 10

- **World Suicide Prevention Day** is observed on **September 10** of every year.
- The international **theme of World Suicide Prevention Day (WSPD) on 10th September 2025 is ‘Changing the Narrative on Suicide’.**
- World Suicide Prevention Day was observed on 10 September 2003.
- The **first World Suicide Report was released in 2014** “Preventing Suicide: A Global Imperative”, It is focused on suicide prevention and makes it a high priority on the global public agenda.

National Forest Martyrs Day: September 11

- **National Forest Martyrs Day** is observed on the **11th of September** of every year.
- **In 2013**, The Ministry of Environment and Forest announced that National Forest Martyrs Day is observed on the 11th of September every year.
- In 1730, during the period of Maharaja Abhay Singh in Rajasthan, he ordered to cut down of the Khejarli trees for wood. However, the people of the Bishnoi Community were against this order.
- This incident took place on September 11, 1730, and was the main cause for the declaration of National Forest Martyrs Day on 11th September 2013.

World First Aid Day 2025 – September 13

- **World First Aid Day 2025** is observed on **September 13** (second Saturday of September).
- The theme for this year is “**First Aid and Climate Change**”, emphasizing the importance of life-saving skills in climate-related emergencies like **floods, heatwaves, and wildfires**.
- Observed annually on the **second Saturday of September**, established by **International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC)**.
- First observed in **2000** by IFRC, now marked worldwide through training and awareness campaigns.

Hindi Diwas: September 14

- **Every year of 14th September** is celebrated as a **Hindi Diwas or hindi day**.
- Many languages have been spoken in India. 22 languages were recognized by the constitution among them, Hindi is the most spoken language in India.
- After India got its independence, in the year of 1949 there were a lot of discussions to make Hindi the official language of India.
- Then it was decided that 14th September would be observed as Hindi Diwas or Hindi day. **In the year of 1953, the first Hindi Diwas was celebrated.**

Engineers Day in India: September 15

- Every year **15th September** is celebrated as **National Engineers Day** in India.
- The theme for this year's Engineers' Day is “**Deep Tech and Engineering Excellence: Driving India's Techade.**”
- In the year of 1968, the Government of India announced that Sir M. Visvesvaraya's birth anniversary was celebrated as Engineers Day in India. From 1968 to now 15th September is observed as Engineers Day in India.
- Sir M. Visvesvaraya passed away in the year of 1962.

International Day of Democracy: September 15

- The **International Day of Democracy** is observed every year on the **15th of September**.
- The **first International Day of Democracy was observed in the year of 2008**. The concept of democracy came from ancient Greece.
- In 1789, the US Constitution was established with US principles of democracy. In the period of 1787 and 1789, France also began to practice democracy.

World Ozone Day is observed on 16 September

- Every year **World Ozone Day** is observed on **16 September**.

- In 1913, the French Physicists Charles Fabry and Henri Buisson discovered the Ozone Layer.
- The theme for World Ozone Day 2025 is **"From science to global action"**.
- The **Montreal Protocol** was first implemented on 1 January 1989.

September 17 is observed as World Patient Safety Day

- Every year **September 17 is observed as World Patient Safety Day**.
- The World Patient Safety Day 2025 theme is **"Safe care for every newborn and every child,"**
- Though this **day was established in 2019**, this day was **first observed** in the year **2021**.

18th of September is celebrated as World Bamboo Day

- Every year the **18th of September** is celebrated as **World Bamboo Day**.
- World Bamboo Day was recognized by the **World Bamboo Organization** in the year of **2009**.
- The World Bamboo Organization Headquarters was located in Antwerp, Belgium.

International Red Panda Day is celebrated on September 20

- Every year the **third Saturday of September** is celebrated as **International Red Panda Day**.
- This year International Red Panda Day is celebrated on the **20th of September**.
- Red Pandas are found in the region of Eastern Himalayas and southwestern China.
- The **Red Pandas were first described in the year 1825**.
- **The first International Red Panda Day was observed on 18th September 2010**.
- Red Panda Network, whose headquarters is in Eugene, Oregon, has been actively participating in order to protect Red Pandas.

International Day of Peace is celebrated on 21st September

- **International Day of Peace is celebrated on 21st September** of every year. Peace is commonly known as the lack of conflict.
- 2025 Global Peace Day Theme: **Act Now for a Peaceful World**

World Alzheimer's Day is observed on 21st September.

- Every year **World Alzheimer's Day is observed on 21st September**.
- Alzheimer's is a brain disorder that slowly destroys the memory and thinking skills of a person.
- The 2025 World Alzheimer's Day theme, **"Ask About Dementia"**.

World Rose Day is observed on 22nd September

- **World Rose Day is observed on 22nd September** of every year.
- This day is observed in order to remember a 12-year-old girl, Melinda Rose.
- She is from Canada and was diagnosed with Askin's Tumour which is a rare form of blood cancer in 1994.

World Rhino Day 2025 will be observed globally on 22 September

- **World Rhino Day 2025** will be observed globally on **22 September** to highlight the urgent need to protect the **rhinoceros**, one of the planet's most ancient and endangered species.
- **World Rhino Day** was established in **2011** by **wildlife conservationists and international organizations**.

25th September as World Pharmacists Day.

- **World Pharmacists Day** is celebrated on **25th September** of every year in order to appreciate the efforts of pharmacists as healthcare workers.
- This day is observed in order to create awareness about pharmacists.
- The theme for World Pharmacists Day in 2025 is "**Think Health, Think Pharmacist**".

Antyodaya Diwas is observed on 25th September

- The **Antyodaya Diwas** is observed every year on **25th September** in India.
- This day is celebrated on September 25 to mark the birth anniversary of Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya.

World Contraception Day is observed on 26th September

- The **World Contraception Day** is observed on **26th September** of every year.
- This day is observed to spread awareness about the available contraceptive methods. Contraception is a birth control method that is used to avoid unwanted pregnancies.

World Environmental Health Day is observed on the 26th of September
