**KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF UNION BUDGET 2026-27**

- Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman presented the Union Budget 2026–27 in the Lok Sabha on February 1, 2026, marking her record ninth consecutive Budget presentation.
- The speech clocked a duration of 1 hour and 25 minutes (85 minutes)
- The Budget aims to boost capital expenditure, strengthen domestic manufacturing, promote technology and infrastructure development, and maintain fiscal discipline.
- This is the **first Union Budget** prepared in **Kartavya Bhawan** and is inspired by **three Kartavyas (duties)**.
- **First Kartavya:** Accelerate and sustain **economic growth** by enhancing **productivity, competitiveness** and **resilience** to global volatility.
- **Second Kartavya:** Fulfil **aspirations** and build **capacity** of people, making them **partners** in India's growth journey.
- **Third Kartavya:** Aligned with **Sabka Sath, Sabka Vikas**, ensuring **inclusive access** to resources and opportunities.

### Launch in Kolkata

- **State Bank of India (SBI)**, India's largest **Public Sector Bank (PSB)**, launched a **Global Trade Finance Centre (GTFC)** in **Kolkata, West Bengal**, to strengthen trade finance and global banking operations.
- In **July 2025**, SBI inaugurated two specialised **GTFCs** located in **Kolkata (West Bengal)** and **Hyderabad (Telangana)** on the occasion of its **70th anniversary**.
- The **GTFC** follows a **centralized system** to streamline **inland trade** and efficiently process **import and export transactions**.
- The centre supports **SBI branches** across **eastern and northern India**, enabling **faster turnaround time**, **strong compliance oversight**, and an **enhanced customer experience** for **domestic and cross-border trade**.
- The **GTFC** is **technology-driven**, leveraging **Artificial Intelligence (AI)**, **Machine Learning (ML)**, and **Blockchain**, marking a shift from traditional **paper-based systems**.
- The **total staff strength** of the **GTFC** is **277**, comprising **161 SBI employees**, **105 outsourced staff**, and **11 temporary personnel**.
- **Local hiring** accounts for **61% of the workforce**, with **169 employees** from **West Bengal**, supporting **regional employment generation**.
- Since **2024**, the **GTFC** has contributed **₹1.40 crore** as **Goods and Services Tax (GST)** to the **West Bengal economy**.

### Union Budget 2026-27 Proposes Self-Help Entrepreneur Marts to Boost Women-Led Enterprises and Strengthen SHG Ecosystem

- The **Union Budget 2026-27** announced the establishment of **Self-Help Entrepreneur (SHE) Marts** as **community-owned retail outlets** to strengthen **women-led enterprises** and deepen the **self-help group (SHG)** ecosystem across states.
- The **SHE Marts initiative** aims to provide a **structured market platform** for products made by **women entrepreneurs**, with **Jharkhand** emerging as a **key beneficiary** due to its **strong SHG base**.
- The programme builds on the **Lakshpati Didi Programme** and aims to help women transition from **credit-based livelihoods** to **ownership of enterprises**.
- **SHE Marts** will be set up within **cluster-level federations** of SHGs and supported through **enhanced and innovative financing instruments** to enable women to access **organised retail** and **stable demand**.

- The **community-owned retail model** allows **women-led SHGs** to **collectively market and sell** their products, **reducing dependence on intermediaries** and improving **income realisation**.
- **Jharkhand** has mobilised around **39 lakh rural SHG members** through the **Jharkhand State Livelihood Promotion Society**, and SHE Marts complement ongoing efforts to transform women from **borrowers into business owners**.
- The initiative aligns with the Budget's broader emphasis on **inclusive growth** and **women-led development**, focusing on **ownership, market access, and scale** to create **sustainable income opportunities**.
- **SHE Marts** aim to help women **reach larger markets, build brands**, and strengthen local institutions such as **self-help groups**.
- The **Lakshpati Didi Programme**, run by the **Ministry of Rural Development**, supports rural women in starting **small businesses** and earning a **steady income** of at least **Rs 1 lakh per year**.
- Under the programme, women are trained in skills like **plumbing, making LED bulbs, and using and repairing drones** to become **financially independent**.
- As per the **Economic Survey 2026**, raising **women's workforce participation** to around **55% by 2050** could be key to sustaining **strong annual GDP growth** in India.

### Union Budget 2026-27 Allocates ₹73,990.94 Crore to DoT to Revive Telecom Infrastructure and Strengthen BSNL

- The **Union Budget 2026-27** allocated **₹73,990.94 crore** to the **Department of Telecommunications (DoT)**, focusing on **telecom infrastructure revival** and strengthening state-owned **BSNL**.
- The allocation for **FY27** is **8.65% lower** than the **FY26 Budget Estimate** of **₹81,005.24 crore** but **38.56% higher** than the **FY26 Revised Estimate** of **₹53,398.17 crore**.
- The **increase** over the revised FY26 figure is largely due to **higher capital infusion** into **Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL)** for **network expansion** and **financial recovery**.
- The **total net allocation** for the DoT in FY27 is **₹80,927.94 crore**, including an additional **₹6,937 crore** from the **Universal Service Obligation Fund (USOF)**.
- Funds from **USOF** will be used for **compensation to telecom service providers**, the **BharatNet rural broadband programme**, and **research and development** in the telecom sector.
- Union Minister for Communications **Jyotiraditya Scindia** stated that the government is working to strengthen **BSNL's financial and operational position**, with **average revenue per user (ARPU)** rising from **₹90 to ₹99**, targeting **₹100**.
- The **capital infusion** along with **internal cash flows** will fund **spectrum costs, network rollout, towers, and other infrastructure needs** of BSNL.
- The **incremental allocation** also supports the **BharatNet programme**, including **expanding fibre connectivity, upgrading infrastructure, and meeting BSNL's internal capital expenditure requirements**.
- The **Budget strategy** reflects a focus on **consolidating public sector telecom capabilities** while continuing investments in **rural connectivity and long-term digital infrastructure**.



## Union Budget 2026-27 Proposes Excise-Duty Exemption on Biogas Component in Blended CNG to Boost Renewable Gas Use

- The **Union Budget 2026-27** proposed an **excise-duty exemption** on the **biogas** or **compressed biogas (CBG)** component in **blended compressed natural gas (CNG)** to promote **renewable gas use** and reduce India's **dependence on imported fossil fuels**.
- The measure aims to **correct double taxation**, as previously both pure CNG and blended CNG attracted **14% central excise duty, 5% GST, and state-level VAT**, which dampened incentives for **biogas blending**.
- Under the new provision, **central excise duty will not be levied** on the **biogas portion** of blended CNG, lowering the **effective tax burden** and improving **cost competitiveness** for **city gas distribution companies (CGDs)**.
- India remains **heavily reliant on imported natural gas**, with **liquefied natural gas (LNG)** imports meeting nearly **50% of domestic demand**, prompting policy support for **renewable alternatives**.
- The **SATAT (Sustainable Alternative Towards Affordable Transportation)** scheme, launched in **2018** by the **Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas**, targets **15 million tonnes of CBG production**, though only around **190 plants** have been commissioned so far.
- The **excise exemption** provides a **financial incentive** for **CGDs to increase CBG blending levels**: at **5% CBG blend**, only **95% of the volume** attracts excise duty; at **50:50 blend**, **half the volume is exempt**.
- Despite **central excise relief**, blended CNG is often treated as **natural gas by states**, with **VAT ranging from 5% to 15%**, so further benefits depend on **state-level exemptions** for the **CBG portion**.
- Combined with support under **rural renewable energy programmes**, the **excise exemption** signals **long-term policy support for renewable gas**, but its success depends on **coordinated Centre–state action** and **infrastructure development** by **city gas distributors**.



## Union Budget 2026-27 Promotes Astronomy Through New Telescopes and Planetarium Initiatives

- The **Union Budget 2026-27** announced a **major expansion** of India's **ground-based astronomy infrastructure**, with plans to **establish and upgrade four key facilities** across **Ladakh and southern India**.
- The initiatives aim to **strengthen India's capabilities** in **solar physics, deep-space observation, and public science education**.
- All projects will be implemented by the **Indian Institute of Astrophysics (IIA)**, headquartered in **Bengaluru**, including **two new national-class telescopes**, an **upgrade of the Himalayan Chandra Telescope** in Ladakh, and a **new planetarium-cum-training centre**.
- The **National Large Solar Telescope** will be set up near **Pangong Lake, Ladakh**, as a **two-metre class optical and near-infrared instrument** to study the **Sun's magnetic fields, solar flares, and coronal mass ejections**, complementing **ISRO's Aditya-L1 mission**.

- The **National Large Optical-Infrared Telescope**, a **10–12 metre facility** in **Hanle, Ladakh**, will observe **optical and infrared wavelengths**, enabling studies of **distant galaxies, star-forming regions, and exoplanets**.
- The **Himalayan Chandra Telescope**, operational in **Hanle since 2000**, will be **upgraded** to extend its scientific capabilities, supporting research on **variable stars, supernovae, and active galaxies**, reinforcing **Ladakh** as India's **principal astronomy hub**.
- The **Cosmos-2 planetarium and training centre** will be built in **Amaravati, Andhra Pradesh**, featuring **advanced digital projection** and **interactive exhibits** to promote **public science education**, following **Cosmos-1** in **Mysuru**.

## NATIONAL AND STATE NEWS

### Adampur Airport Renamed Sri Guru Ravidass Maharaj Ji Airport; Halwara Civil Terminal Inaugurated

- **Prime Minister Narendra Modi** renamed **Adampur Airport** in **Jalandhar** as **Sri Guru Ravidass Maharaj Ji Airport** and also inaugurated a **new civil terminal** at **Halwara Airport** in **Ludhiana**.
- The renaming honours **Guru Ravidass**, a revered **Bhakti movement saint and social reformer**, and carries strong **social and cultural significance**, especially in Punjab.
- The decision fulfilled a **long-pending demand** from various political parties and social groups.
- A **resolution for renaming** Adampur Airport was passed by the **Punjab Vidhan Sabha in 2020**, and the demand was reiterated by the current state government.
- The move combines **cultural recognition with infrastructure development**, strengthening **regional air connectivity** in Punjab.
- **Adampur Airport** was revamped at a cost of **₹125 crore** under the **UDAN 5.0 scheme** and serves the **Doaba region** of Punjab.
- The civil terminal at Adampur is spread over **40 acres** and operates using the **Adampur Air Force Station** airstrip.
- Airport operations at Adampur resumed on **31 March 2025** after a **four-year suspension due to the Covid-19 pandemic**.
- Currently, Adampur Airport operates limited flights by **Star Air and IndiGo**, connecting cities such as **Mumbai, Nanded and Bengaluru**.
- Connectivity challenges remain due to a **narrow 4.3-kilometre rural approach road**, with **land acquisition delays** cited as the main reason for non-expansion.
- Earlier air routes to **Delhi, Jaipur and Mumbai** were discontinued due to **low passenger demand**, highlighting sustainability challenges under regional connectivity schemes.
- At **Halwara Airport** in **Ludhiana**, a **new civil terminal** was virtually inaugurated by the Prime Minister.
- The Halwara civil terminal has been built at a cost of **₹54 crore** by expanding the **Halwara Air Force base**.
- The terminal has a capacity to handle **300 passengers at a time**, significantly improving civil aviation facilities for **Ludhiana, an important industrial hub**.
- The twin initiatives support the objectives of the **UDAN (Ude Desh ka Aam Nagrik) scheme**, boosting **regional connectivity and aviation growth** in Punjab.

## Third Edition of Tri-Services Future Warfare Course Launched in New Delhi

- The **third edition of the Future Warfare Course** commenced in **New Delhi from February 2 to February 25, 2026**.
- The course is a **tri-services programme** conducted under the aegis of **Headquarters Integrated Defence Staff (HQ IDS)** in collaboration with the **Centre for Joint Warfare Studies (CENJOWS)**.
- It brings together officers from the **Indian Army, Indian Navy and Indian Air Force**, along with experts from the **defence industry**.
- The programme focuses on **future warfighting concepts, emerging and disruptive technologies, geopolitical challenges, and indigenous defence capabilities**.
- It aims to prepare military leadership for **technology-driven, multi-domain and integrated warfare scenarios**.
- Key areas of study include **cyber warfare, space domain, artificial intelligence-based systems, defence supply chains, rare-earth mineral dependencies, and innovation in combat operations**.
- Participants range from **Majors to Major Generals and equivalent ranks**, ensuring a blend of **technical expertise, operational experience and strategic perspective**.
- Representatives from **defence startups, Micro Small and Medium Enterprises, Defence Public Sector Undertakings and private industry** are also part of the programme.
- The expanded three-week course builds on the success of its **first edition held in September 2024**.
- The programme aligns with the vision of **Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan** to ensure the **Indian Armed Forces remain adaptive, integrated and future-ready** in addressing evolving security challenges.

### Third Edition of Future Warfare Course Begins in New Delhi

The third edition of the tri-services Future Warfare Course is scheduled to commence at Manikarnika Centre in New Delhi from 02-25 Feb 2026, under the aegis of Headquarters Integrated Defence Staff and in partnership with the Centre for Joint Warfare Studies (CENJOWS). This edition features an enhanced curriculum covering specialized subjects and domain-specific warfare developments in military operations.

The course focuses on developing an erudite understanding on how war fighting is being impacted by technology, necessitating a relook at one's thinking, concepts, doctrines, strategies and TTPs. It also caters for deeper exploration of critical topics, practical demonstrations of emerging technologies and visits to institutions of critical importance to the capabilities of the Defence Forces.

The course comprises participants from the three Services, as well as representatives from the defence industry including startups, MSMEs, DPSUs and the private industry. Amongst the Services participants, the seniority of the officers varies from Majors to Major Generals (and their equivalents), with the junior officers bringing their technical flair and expertise and the senior officers their operational experience and strategic knowledge.

The Future warfare course will align operational priorities of the Armed Forces with the capabilities of the indigenous defence industry and enable a free flowing discussion on the various facets of modern and futuristic war fighting. A diverse range of experts including scientists, serving officers, ex-ambassadors, industry experts and academic professionals will ensure that a holistic analysis of India's security challenges are debated in a thorough and professional manner.

- The **UN Environment Programme (UNEP)** released **The State of Finance for Nature 2026** report, highlighting a stark imbalance in global environmental financing.

#### Key Highlights :

- The report finds that for every **USD 1** invested in protecting nature, the world spends nearly **USD 30** on activities that damage it, with **USD 7.3 trillion** flowing into **nature-negative finance** in 2023.

- Of the total **nature-negative finance**, **USD 4.9 trillion** came from **private sources**, mainly in **energy, utilities, industrials, and basic materials**, while **USD 2.4 trillion** came from **environmentally harmful public subsidies** to **fossil fuels, agriculture, and infrastructure**.
- In contrast, **Nature-based Solutions (NbS)** received only **USD 220 billion**, with nearly **90% from public sources** and only **10% from private investment**.
- **UNEP** estimates that **NbS investments** must increase **2.5 times** to reach **USD 571 billion annually by 2030**, which is about **0.5% of global GDP**.
- **Nature-negative finance** refers to global financial flows to activities harming nature, such as **fossil fuel extraction, unsustainable agriculture, and deforestation**, accounting for **7% of global GDP** in 2023.
- **Environmentally Harmful Subsidies (EHS)**, totaling **USD 2.4 trillion**, distort market prices, making environmental destruction cheaper than conservation.
- **Nature-based Solutions (NbS)** involve actions to **protect, sustainably manage, and restore ecosystems**, addressing societal challenges like **climate change, food security, and disaster risk**, while providing human well-being and biodiversity benefits.
- **International frameworks** driving **NbS finance** include the **Rio Conventions**:
- **UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)**.
- **Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD)**.
- **UN Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD)**.
- These set targets for **climate stability, biodiversity conservation, and land restoration by 2030**.
- For **India**, scaling **Nature-based Solutions** through reforms like the **Nature Transition X-Curve, green taxonomy, subsidy rationalisation, and private capital mobilisation** is critical to protect biodiversity while sustaining long-term economic growth.

### India Emerges as a Major Engine of Global Urban Growth in 2025: UN Report

- A **United Nations report (2025)** states that **around 45% of the global population lives in urban areas**, a sharp rise from **20% in 1950**.
- **India has emerged as one of the biggest drivers of global urban growth**, placing it at the centre of worldwide urbanisation trends.
- India currently has **five megacities**, each with a population of **more than 10 million**.
- **New Delhi**, with a population of **over 30 million**, is among the **four largest cities in the world**, alongside **Jakarta, Dhaka and Tokyo**.
- Major Indian cities such as **Mumbai, Bengaluru, Chennai and Kolkata** continue to attract **migration, jobs and investment**.
- The 2025 UN report introduced the **“Degree of Urbanization” method**, which classifies cities based on **population size and density**, not just administrative boundaries.
- Under this method, **densely populated urban areas outside official city limits** are also counted as cities.
- Due to this revised methodology, **population estimates of many Indian and Asian cities have increased**, offering a **more accurate picture of urban living patterns**.
- **Asia dominates global urbanisation**, hosting **9 of the world’s 10 largest cities** and nearly **60% of all megacities**.
- **India plays a central role in Asia’s urban growth**, supported by its **young population, internal migration and expanding service and manufacturing sectors**.
- While megacities receive attention, the report highlights that **most urban growth is occurring in small and medium-sized cities**.
- Nearly **96% of cities globally have populations below 1 million**.
- In India, **smaller cities are growing faster than large metros** due to **improved road connectivity, digital infrastructure and emerging local industries**.
- Cities such as **Kozhikode**, with a population exceeding **5 million**, highlight the **shift away from metro-centric urban development**.
- The report underscores both **opportunities and challenges** for India in areas such as **urban planning, housing, employment, infrastructure and sustainability**.

India is emerging as one of the strongest contributors to global urban expansion in 2025, according to the United Nations' World's Cities in 2025 report, reflecting a long-term worldwide shift towards city-based living.

#### India's Growing Role in the Global Urban Landscape

Urban areas now accommodate around 45% of the world's population in 2025, a sharp rise from 20% in 1950, underlining the growing economic and social importance of cities.

India plays a major role in this trend, with 5 megacities, each having more than 10 million people. New Delhi, with an estimated population exceeding 30 million, ranks among the world's 4 largest cities, alongside Jakarta, Dhaka, and Tokyo.

Kolkata features in the global top 10, while Mumbai, Bengaluru and Chennai continue to act as major urban centres driving growth and employment.

- **Global Soft Power Index 2026** ranks countries based on their ability to **influence and attract others through culture, values, governance, and ideas**, rather than military force or economic pressure.

- Strong soft power helps attract **tourists, investors, skilled talent**, and strengthens **international partnerships**.

- The **Indian Army** and the **Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP)** conducted a joint training exercise named “**Agni Pariksha**” at **Sigar** in **East Siang** district, **Arunachal Pradesh** from **January 19 to 24, 2026** to enhance **inter-force combat synergy** and **operational integration**.

### Archaeologists Unearth 1,400-Year-Old Zapotec Tomb in Oaxaca, Shedding Light on Indigenous Funerary Traditions

- Archaeologists in **southern Mexico** discovered a **1,400-year-old tomb** belonging to the **Zapotec civilization** at **San Pablo Huitzo, Oaxaca** in **2025**, providing insights into **Indigenous funerary traditions and social organisation**.
- The tomb dates to around **A.D. 600**, during the flourishing of the **Zapotecs**, also known as the **"Cloud People"**, who inhabited the **Oaxaca Valley**.
- The **Zapotec civilisation** emerged around **700 B.C.** and continued until the **Spanish conquest in 1521**, with **Zapotec-speaking communities** still present in Mexico today.
- At the **entrance** of the tomb, archaeologists found a **large carved owl** with wide eyes, whose beak reveals the **painted face of a Zapotec lord**, symbolising **death, power, and honoured ancestors**.
- Inside, a **stone doorway** separates **two chambers**, with a **lintel engraved with calendrical names**, reflecting the **Zapotec system** of identifying individuals by **birth-date symbols**.

#### Renowned Jesuit Priest and Educationist Father Thomas V. Kunnunkal Passed Away at 99 in New Delhi
