Department of Financial Services, Ministry of Finance Releases Report on Socio-Economic Impact of RuPay Debit Card & Low-Value BHIM-UPI (P2M) Incentive Scheme at Chintan Shivir 2026

- The **Department of Financial Services (DFS)**, Ministry of Finance, released a report titled **“Socio-Economic Impact Analysis of the Incentive Scheme for Promotion of RuPay Debit Card and low-value BHIM-UPI (Person-to-Merchant) transactions”** during **Chintan Shivir** (13–14 February 2026).
- The study was conducted by an **independent third-party research agency** in consultation with the **National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI)** to evaluate the effectiveness of the government’s **incentive framework**.

The Department of Financial Services (DFS), Ministry of Finance, released a report titled “Socio-Economic Impact Analysis of the Incentive Scheme for Promotion of RuPay Debit Card and low-value BHIM-UPI (Person-to-Merchant) transactions” during the Chintan Shivir held on 13th-14th February 2026.


Key Highlights :

- The **Incentive Scheme** (FY 2021–22 to FY 2024–25) aimed to **accelerate digital payment adoption**, **reduce cash dependence**, and **formalise routine economic activity**.
- It provided **structured budgetary support** to acquiring banks and ecosystem participants to ensure digital payments remain **affordable, accessible, and sustainable**.
- **Methodology & Reach**
- The analysis was based on a **primary survey of 10,378 respondents** across **15 States**, covering **6,167 users**, **2,199 merchants**, and **2,012 service providers**.
- The study spanned **five geographical zones** (North, South, East, West, and North-East), covering both **urban and semi-urban locations**.
- **Key User Insights**
- **UPI** has emerged as the **preferred mode of payment (57%)** over **cash (38%)** due to ease of use and instant fund transfer.
- **65% of UPI users** report **multiple digital transactions per day**, with the highest adoption among the **18–25 age group (66%)**.
- **90% of users** reported **increased confidence** in digital payments, leading to a visible **decline in cash usage and ATM withdrawals**.
- **Cashback incentives** motivated **52% of users**, while **74%** cited **speed of payment** as the primary advantage.
- **Merchant & Ecosystem Impact**
- Digital acceptance is near-universal, with **94% of small merchants adopting UPI**; **57% reported a sales increase** after adoption.
- **72% of merchants** expressed satisfaction, citing **faster transactions, better record-keeping, and operational convenience**.
- Incentives **reduced cost barriers** and accelerated **merchant onboarding** across all income groups.

- Digital transactions increased **nearly 11 times** during the scheme, with **UPI's share rising to ~80%** of the primary payment rail.
- **UPI QR codes** expanded significantly from **9.3 crore to ~65.8 crore**.
- The ecosystem grew from **16 to 38 third-party app providers**, and the number of **banks operational on UPI** rose from **216 (March 2021) to 661 (March 2025)**.
- **Financial Outlay & Long-term Benefits**
- The government provided a total of **₹8,276 crore** for the scheme.
- **Annual incentive disbursements** were:
 - FY 2021–22: **₹1,389 crore**
 - FY 2022–23: **₹2,210 crore**
 - FY 2023–24: **₹3,631 crore**
 - FY 2024–25: **₹1,046 crore**
- Beyond growth, the scheme contributed to the **formalisation of the economy**, creation of **digital footprints**, **enhanced transparency**, and **fintech innovation**.

First Meeting of BRICS Sherpas and Sous Sherpas Held in New Delhi under India's Chairship

- The **first meeting of BRICS Sherpas and Sous Sherpas under India's Chairship 2026** was held in **New Delhi**
- The meeting was chaired by **Mr. Sudhakar Dalela**, Secretary (Economic Relations) and India's **BRICS Sherpa**, supported by **Mr. Shambhu L. Hakki**, Joint Secretary (Multilateral Economic Relations) and India's **BRICS Sous Sherpa**
- BRICS Sherpas and senior officials from Brazil, China, Egypt, Ethiopia, Indonesia, Iran, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa and United Arab Emirates** participated in the meeting
- The BRICS Sherpas and Country Representatives jointly called on the **External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar on 10 February 2026**
- India presented its Chairship priorities under the theme **"Building for Resilience, Innovation, Cooperation and Sustainability"**
- Various **Ministries and Departments of the Government of India** presented priorities and proposed activities across multiple BRICS thematic areas
- Key areas of cooperation included **health, agriculture, labour and employment, disaster risk reduction, environment, climate change, energy, innovation, Information and Communication Technology, security and counter-terrorism, and economic and financial domains**
- A productive exchange of views was held on the **institutional development of the BRICS grouping**
- Under India's **people-centric Chairship approach**, presentations were made on cooperation in **sports, youth connect, cultural engagements, BRICS Academic Forum, BRICS Think Tank Council, BRICS Civil Forum, BRICS Business Council and BRICS Women's Business Alliance**
- Representatives of **BRICS Partner countries** participated in the opening session of the meeting

The first meeting of BRICS Sherpas and Sous Sherpas under India's Chairship was held from 9-10 February 2026 in New Delhi. The meeting was Chaired by Secretary (Economic Relations) Mr. Sudhakar Dalela, India's BRICS Sherpa, supported by Joint Secretary (Multilateral Economic Relations) Mr. Shambhu L. 2. During the meeting, India presented the priorities for its Chairship in 2026 under the theme "Building for Resilience, Innovation, Cooperation and Sustainability". Several Ministries and Departments of the Government of India presented India's priorities and proposed activities under various BRICS thematic areas, including cooperation in health, agriculture, labour & employment, disaster risk reduction, environment, climate change, energy, innovation, ICT, security and counter-terrorism, economic and financial domains. Further, there was a productive exchange of views on institutional development of the BRICS grouping. In line with India's approach of having a "people-centric" Chairship, presentations on cooperation in sports, youth connect, cultural engagements, BRICS Academic Forum, BRICS Think Tank Council, BRICS Civil Forum as well as the BRICS Business Council and the BRICS Women's Business Alliance were also made.

3. The representatives of the BRICS Partner countries participated at the opening session of the meeting. The BRICS Members and Partner countries appreciated the theme and priorities identified by India for its Chairship, which builds on the cooperative activities carried out under previous BRICS Chairships, and shared their perspectives in advancing priorities of resilience, innovation, cooperation and sustainability, and people-centric approach.

- Member countries shared their perspectives on advancing the priorities of **resilience, innovation, cooperation, sustainability and people-centric development**
- Delegates visited the **National Crafts Museum and Hastakala Academy** and **Akshardham Temple**
- BRICS Sherpas and Sous Sherpas will continue to meet regularly throughout the year to coordinate work across various thematic tracks

MeitY Amends IT Rules, 2021 to Mandate Labelling of AI-Generated Content and Reduce Takedown Timelines

- The **Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY)** amended the **Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021** through the Amendment Rules, 2026
- The revised rules mandate **labelling of AI-generated or synthetically generated content** by users and social media platforms
- The amended rules will come into effect from **20 February 2026**
- Social media platforms must prominently label “**synthetically generated**” or **AI-generated images and videos**
- Platforms with over **5 million users** must obtain a **user declaration** for AI-generated content and conduct **technical verification before publication**
- The objective is to combat **deepfakes, misinformation, privacy violations, and threats to national integrity**
- The final rules narrow the earlier broad definition of **Synthetically Generated Information (SGI)** and provide exemptions
- Exemptions include **automatically retouched smartphone photographs and film special effects**
- The rules strictly prohibit AI-generated content related to:
 - Child sexual exploitation and abuse
 - Forged documents
 - Information on developing explosives
 - Deepfakes impersonating real individuals
- Large platforms are required to deploy **reasonable and appropriate technical measures** to detect and prevent unlawful synthetic content
- Platforms must ensure **labelling, provenance tracking, and identifier requirements** for permissible AI-generated material
- Several digital platforms are part of the **Coalition for Content Provenance and Authenticity (C2PA)**, which develops standards for embedding invisible digital markers in AI-generated content
- The government clarified that it does not endorse any single technology framework but seeks to ensure **traceability and reliability in AI content detection**
- The amended rules significantly reduce content takedown timelines:
 - Government and court-ordered takedowns: **2–3 hours** (earlier 24–36 hours)

The story so far: The Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) earlier this week notified an amendment to the IT Rules, 2021, that would require users and social media platforms to label AI-generated content, and tighten the takedown timelines for all content — not just AI-generated posts — from 24-36 hours to two to three hours. The rules come into effect on February 20.

- User complaints (defamation, misinformation): **1 week** (earlier 2 weeks)
- Sensitive content reports under Rule 3(2)(b): **36 hours** (earlier 72 hours)
- Platforms must now notify users of their **terms and conditions every three months**, instead of annually
- Users must be explicitly warned that posting unlawful AI-generated content may result in:
 - Immediate removal of content
 - Suspension or termination of accounts
 - Disclosure of identity to law enforcement agencies
- The amendments aim to enhance **accountability, rapid response, and responsible use of Artificial Intelligence in the digital ecosystem**

Union Budget Sanctions National Large Solar Telescope and National Large Optical-Near Infrared Telescope

- In the **Union Budget**, the Government sanctioned the establishment of two major telescopes:
 - **National Large Solar Telescope (NLST)**
 - **National Large Optical-Near Infrared Telescope (NLOT)**
 - The initiative aims to strengthen India's capabilities in **solar studies, space weather research, and deep space exploration**
 - The **National Large Solar Telescope (NLST)** is a **2-metre aperture solar telescope** coming up in the **Merak region near Pangong Tso Lake (Ladakh)**
 - It will operate in the **visible and near-infrared wavelengths** of the electromagnetic spectrum
 - Purpose of NLST:
 - Study fundamental solar dynamics and magnetism
 - Analyse energetic solar events
 - Map space-weather processes affecting Earth
 - Protect national space assets such as satellites and space launches
 - NLST will become India's **third ground-based solar observatory**
 - Currently operational solar observatories in India:
 - **Kodaikanal Solar Observatory (Tamil Nadu, established 1899)**
 - **Udaipur Solar Observatory (Rajasthan, established 1975)**
 - The **National Large Optical-Near Infrared Telescope (NLOT)** will be a **13.7-metre aperture segmented-mirror telescope** to be built in **Hanle (Ladakh)**
 - It will consist of **90 smaller hexagonal mirror segments**, functioning together as one large primary mirror
 - The telescope will operate in the **optical and near-infrared wavelengths** of the electromagnetic spectrum
 - It will be among the **world's largest telescopes** in the optical-infrared

- Objectives of NLOT:
 - Conduct frontier research on **exoplanets**
 - Study **stellar and galactic evolution**
 - Observe **supernovae**
 - Explore clues about the **origins of the universe**
 - The establishment of these telescopes will significantly enhance India's position in **astronomy, astrophysics, and space science research**

Sangtam Naga Tribal Body in Nagaland Bans Pangolin Hunting and Trade

- The **United Sangtam Likhum Pumji (USLP)**, apex tribal body of the Sangtam Naga community in **Nagaland**, passed a resolution banning **pangolin hunting and trade** within its jurisdiction
- The decision strengthens **community-led conservation efforts** and reinforces protections under the **Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972**
- Pangolins are among the **most trafficked mammals globally**, targeted for their scales, meat, and illegal wildlife trade
- In India, two species are found:
 - **Indian Pangolin (*Manis crassicaudata*)**
 - **Chinese Pangolin (*Manis pentadactyla*)**
 Both species are classified as **Endangered**
- Globally, all eight pangolin species are listed under **Appendix I of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES)**, prohibiting international commercial trade
- The initiative supports the **Countering Pangolin Trafficking Project** led by the **Wildlife Trust of India (WTI)** with support from the **Wildlife Conservation Network Pangolin Crisis Fund**
- The project focuses on:
 - Community awareness
 - Strengthening law enforcement
 - Monitoring illegal trade networks
 - Promoting sustainable conservation practices
- Nagaland and other Northeastern states follow strong **community-based land ownership systems**, where tribal councils manage forest areas
- Community-led conservation improves local enforcement, reduces poaching, and ensures long-term sustainability
- Northeast India is biodiversity-rich but vulnerable to wildlife trafficking due to proximity to international borders
- The Sangtam Naga resolution sets a model for other tribal bodies and strengthens grassroots conservation governance
- Pangolins are nocturnal mammals with protective keratin scales and play a key ecological role in controlling insect populations



Jorhat: In a significant step forward for pangolin conservation in Northeast India, the **United Sangtam Likhum Pumji (USLP)**, the apex tribal body of the **Sangtam Naga community**, has officially passed a resolution to protect pangolins within its jurisdiction.

- The move enhances India's commitment to **global biodiversity conservation and wildlife protection efforts**

India Becomes Second-Largest Active Smartphone Installed Base Globally in 2025: Counterpoint Research

- India has emerged as the **second-largest active installed base of smartphones globally** in 2025, according to **Counterpoint Research**

India has the second-largest active installed base of smartphones in the world, behind only China, according to a yet-to-be-released Counterpoint Research report based on 2025 data.

The country has an active installed base of over 740 million smartphones — more than half of its population of 1.45 billion.

- India has over **740 million active smartphones**, ranking just behind **China**
- The figure indicates that more than half of India's population of approximately **1.45 billion** actively uses smartphones
- The term **active installed base** refers to the total number of smartphones currently in use, unlike shipment data which measures annual sales
- The metric reflects **device longevity, user retention, ecosystem loyalty, and replacement cycles**, providing a deeper understanding of digital penetration
- India's large installed base highlights strong smartphone adoption across both urban and rural regions
- China remains the global leader in active installed base due to its mature electronics ecosystem and strong domestic brands
- India's growth has been driven by:
 - Affordable **4G and 5G devices**
 - Expansion of digital payments through **Unified Payments Interface (UPI)**
 - Government initiatives such as **Digital India**
 - Domestic manufacturing push under **Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme**
- The average smartphone retention period in India is **42 months**, compared to the global average of **47 months**
- Indian consumers upgrade smartphones approximately every **3.5 years**, indicating rising purchasing power and demand for improved features
- Growth of mid-range and premium segments has contributed to shorter upgrade cycles
- Structural drivers of India's smartphone expansion include:
 - Rapid digital expansion in banking, e-commerce, telemedicine, and education
 - Affordable internet services
 - Expansion of domestic smartphone manufacturing
 - Ongoing **5G rollout**

- India's smartphone growth accelerated after 2016 due to cheaper data plans and increased competition among brands
- The country has transitioned from a feature phone-dominated market to a **smartphone-first digital economy**
- The shift from shipment-based metrics to installed base analysis indicates the **maturity of India's smartphone ecosystem**
- Smartphones now play a central role in India's **economic growth, digital transformation, and social connectivity**

Delhi Approves Chief Minister Skill Development Scheme; 3,728 Artisans to Be Trained in 2025–26

- The **Delhi Government** approved the **Chief Minister Skill Development Scheme** to support artisans associated with **khadi, handloom, and cottage industries**
- **Chief Minister Rekha Gupta** announced the initiative, emphasizing the need to connect traditional artisans with modern and global markets
- The scheme will be implemented through the **Delhi Khadi and Village Industries Board (DKVIB)**
- In the first phase during **2025–26**, around **3,728 artisans** will receive training with an approved budget of **₹8.9 crore**
- For **2026–27**, the government is expected to allocate **₹57.5 crore** to expand the programme
- Each beneficiary will undergo **12 days of structured training**, including a **2-day Entrepreneurship Development Programme (EDP)**
- Training will be conducted in batches of **35–45 participants** to ensure focused guidance
- Beneficiaries will receive a **stipend of ₹4,800 (₹400 per day)** along with **₹100 per day for meals**
- After completion, artisans will be provided with **essential toolkits**, including foot-operated sewing machines where required
- A major component of the scheme is **digital onboarding** of artisans
- Each artisan will receive an **e-catalogue with product photographs and profile details**
- Products will be listed on the **Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC)**, enabling access to national and international markets
- The initiative aims to remove middlemen, improve profit margins, and enhance market visibility for artisans
- The scheme aligns with the objectives of the **Union Budget 2026–27**, which emphasized branding, quality improvement, and global market linkage for artisans
- The initiative also reflects the vision of **Prime Minister Narendra Modi** under **Viksit Bharat**, highlighting skill development as central to nation-building



NEW DELHI: The Delhi government has approved the "Chief Minister Skill Development Scheme" aimed at providing structured training, financial support and digital market access to artisans engaged in khadi, handloom, cottage industries and the unorganised sector.

The decision was cleared at a Cabinet meeting chaired by chief minister Rekha Gupta. The scheme seeks to equip traditional workers with upgraded skills and connect them directly to online marketplaces, including the Open Network for Digital Commerce

- Khadi and village industries generate employment for millions, particularly women and marginalized communities
- At the national level, the sector is supported by the **Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC)**, while state-level implementation is handled by bodies such as **Delhi Khadi and Village Industries Board (DKVIB)**
- The scheme aims to promote **economic inclusion, employment generation, digital empowerment, and preservation of traditional crafts**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi Inaugurates Seva Teerth in New Delhi; PMO, NSCS and Cabinet Secretariat Shifted Under One Roof

- **Prime Minister Narendra Modi** inaugurated **Seva Teerth** in **New Delhi** marking a major step in administrative reforms
- The newly developed complex houses the **Prime Minister's Office (PMO)**, **National Security Council Secretariat (NSCS)**, and **Cabinet Secretariat** under one roof
- Seva Teerth aims to streamline top-level administration by improving coordination, reducing delays, enhancing security, and promoting integrated governance
- The complex carries the motto "**Nagriko Devo Bhava**", meaning Citizens are akin to God, reflecting citizen-centric governance
- The date 13 February holds historic significance as **New Delhi was formally inaugurated as India's capital on 13 February 1931**, marking 95 years in 2026
- Along with Seva Teerth, the Prime Minister inaugurated **Kartavya Bhavan 1 and 2**, which will house multiple key ministries
- Ministries shifting to Kartavya Bhavan include:
 - **Ministry of Finance**
 - **Ministry of Defence**
 - **Ministry of Health and Family Welfare**
 - **Ministry of Corporate Affairs**
 - **Ministry of Education**
 - **Ministry of Culture**
 - **Ministry of Law and Justice**
 - **Ministry of Information and Broadcasting**
 - **Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare**
 - **Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers**
 - **Ministry of Tribal Affairs**
- The consolidation is expected to improve **inter-ministerial coordination and administrative efficiency**
- The Prime Minister chaired the final Cabinet meeting at **South Block** before relocation, marking the end of an administrative era

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday (February 13, 2026) inaugurated the Seva Teerth complex, which will house the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), the National Security Council Secretariat and the Cabinet Secretariat.

- The colonial-era **South Block and North Block**, which functioned as India's administrative hub since 1921, will be converted into the **Yuge Yugeen Bharat National Museum**
- The redevelopment aligns with the **Central Vista Redevelopment Project**, focusing on modernization while preserving heritage structures
- The new PMO is located at **Seva Teerth-1 in Executive Enclave-I near Vayu Bhawan**
- The complex consists of three interconnected buildings:
 - **Seva Teerth-1 – Prime Minister's Office**
 - **Seva Teerth-2 – Cabinet Secretariat**
 - **Seva Teerth-3 – National Security Council Secretariat and National Security Advisor's Office**
 - The enclave will also include **India House**, a venue for hosting high-level international delegations
 - Key features of the complex include:
 - Smart access control and surveillance systems
 - Digitally integrated infrastructure
 - Centralized public interface zones
 - Conference halls and reception areas
 - Renewable energy systems
 - Water conservation and waste management facilities
- The complex is built to **4-Star Green Rating for Integrated Habitat Assessment (GRIHA) standards**, ensuring sustainability and reduced environmental impact
- History of the Prime Minister's Office:
 - 1947 – Began as the **Prime Minister's Secretariat**
 - 1964 – Granted formal status during the tenure of **Lal Bahadur Shastri**
 - Expanded authority during **Indira Gandhi's** tenure
 - 1977 – Renamed as **Prime Minister's Office** during **Morarji Desai's** government.

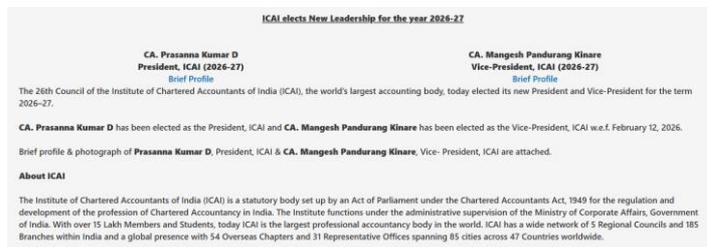

During the meeting, a defence cooperation agreement is expected to be renewed for another 10 years, with an MoU on Joint Venture for manufacturing of Hammer missile likely to be signed in the presence of both Defence Ministers. An announcement is also expected with respect to reciprocal deployment of officers at the Indian Army and French Land Forces establishments.

The two Ministers are also expected to witness the virtual inauguration of the H125 Light Utility Helicopter Final Assembly of Tata Airbus by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and French President Mr Emmanuel Macron at Vemagal, Karnataka.

Defence has traditionally formed an important pillar of the relationship between the two countries. The strong and enduring bilateral ties were vividly reflected in 2024–2025 through a series of high-profile exchanges. PM Modi was the Guest of Honour at the Bastille Day Parade in July 2023, before the French President granted the Republic Day Parade 2024 as the Chief Guest.

The recent India-EU Security & Defence Partnership marks a significant step in deepening collective engagement with European nations. Military-to-Military cooperation is on an increase. India and France have been regularly carrying out three major exercises - Exercise Shakti with Army, Exercise Varma with Navy, and Exercise Garuda with Air Force, and several other opportunity engagements.

This would be the maiden visit of Ms Catherine Vautrin to India after she took over as the French Defence Minister on October 12, 2025. The India-France Annual Defence Dialogue is a structured ministerial-level bilateral meeting to review and guide defence & security cooperation. The 5th edition of the meeting was held in France from October 11–13, 2023.

Defence Acquisition Council Approves ₹3.25 Lakh Crore Deal to Procure 114 Additional Rafale Fighter Jets from France

- The **Defence Acquisition Council (DAC)**, chaired by Union Defence Minister **Rajnath Singh**, approved a proposal worth **₹3.25 lakh crore** (≈ USD 40 billion) to acquire **114 additional Rafale** fighter jets from France.
- The **DAC** also approved the purchase of **six additional Boeing P-8I** maritime patrol aircraft for the **Indian Navy (IN)**.
- The approval grants the **Acceptance of Necessity (AoN)**, a key step in India's defence procurement process, allowing the government to proceed with **detailed contract negotiations** and pricing.
- Under the **Rafale** deal, **18 jets** will be delivered in **fly-away condition** by **Dassault Aviation**, France, while the remaining **96 jets** will be **manufactured in India** under the **Make in India** initiative.
- With this acquisition, India's total **Rafale fleet** will increase to **176 jets**, including **36** already inducted by the **Indian Air Force (IAF)** and **26 Rafale-M** jets for the Indian Navy.
- **Dassault Aviation**, headquartered in **Saint-Cloud, France**, was established in **1929**, with **Eric Trappier** as its CEO.
- The deal includes **transfer of advanced fighter jet technology** and is structured as a **strategic partnership** to strengthen the **Make in India** programme.
- The final acquisition will require clearance from the **Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS)**, chaired by Prime Minister **Narendra Modi**.
- The decision was announced ahead of French President **Emmanuel Macron's** official visit to New Delhi, highlighting its **strategic and diplomatic significance**.

- The collaboration with **industry partners** will focus on **applied research, customized industrial solutions, talent development, and startup translation**.
- The center will also release **foundational datasets, AI models, and interfaces** as **public goods** to support India's diverse **manufacturing ecosystem**, including **MSMEs**.
- The initiative aligns with the **Ministry of Education's** efforts, which has already established **four other AI centers**, aiming to strengthen **industrial AI research** and applications in India.

Grandfather of the internet, David J. Farber Passed Away at 91 in Tokyo

- **David J. Farber**, widely regarded as the “**grandfather of the internet**”, passed away in Tokyo at the age of 91 due to **heart failure**.

About David J. Farber :

- Farber was a **distinguished computer science professor** who spent decades shaping the **foundations of modern networking** and **mentoring pioneers** who built the **core architecture** of the global internet.
- Since 2018, he has been teaching at **Keio University, Japan**, contributing to **digital education and research**.
- Farber began his career in the mid-1950s at **Bell Laboratories**, during a period when computers operated largely in isolation.
- His early research focused on **linking computing systems with telecommunications**, laying the groundwork for **networked communication** that would evolve into today's **internet infrastructure**.

- He has trained young ophthalmologists and led multiple outreach programmes
- Dr Venkatesh played a key role in establishing the **Aravind Eye Care System Puducherry facility** in 2003 after completing a glaucoma fellowship in Madurai
- Over the past two decades, both doctors have strengthened programmes delivering **affordable cataract surgeries** to underserved communities
- Cataract remains the **leading cause of blindness globally**, especially in low- and middle-income countries
- High-volume and low-cost models such as **Manual Small Incision Cataract Surgery (MSICS)** help reduce preventable blindness at scale
- The **Aravind Eye Care System**, founded in Tamil Nadu, operates on a **cross-subsidy model**, where paying patients subsidise free or low-cost treatment for economically weaker sections
- Aravind has performed millions of cataract surgeries and is considered a global benchmark in **community ophthalmology and sustainable eye care delivery**
