Reserve Bank of India proposes mandatory reporting of OTC forex and interest rate derivatives by AD Cat-I banks

- The **Reserve Bank of India (RBI)** has proposed **mandatory reporting of Over-the-Counter (OTC)** foreign exchange and interest rate derivative contracts by **Authorised Dealer Category-I (AD Cat-I) banks**.
- The reporting requirement covers transactions done **directly or via overseas related parties**, including **parent companies, subsidiaries, and entities under common control**, while **associate companies are excluded**.

Key Highlights :

- Banks must report all such trades to the **Clearing Corporation of India Ltd (CCIL) trade repository**, ensuring transparency in **offshore rupee derivative markets**.
- Transactions must be reported on the **trade date or within two working days**; contracts with a **notional value of \$1 million or less** may be exempt from reporting.
- The **RBI** has proposed a **phased implementation**:
- **Within 12 months**: At least **70%** of the notional value must be reported.
- **After 18 months**: Threshold rises to **80%**.
- **After 24 months**: Threshold reaches **90%**.
- The **directions apply to all OTC rupee derivative contracts**, including those traded on **electronic platforms**, but **exclude exchange-traded derivatives**.
- **Back-to-back transactions** and trades between **related parties and other AD Cat-I banks in India** are **exempted** from reporting.
- Reported transaction details must include **notional value, counterparty name, maturity, currency**, and other specifications, with reporting formats prescribed by **CCIL** and approved by **RBI**.
- The proposed framework extends existing reporting norms under the **Master Direction on Risk Management** and **Master Direction on Rupee Interest Rate Derivatives (2025)** to include global rupee-linked OTC derivatives by **offshore related parties**.
- The initiative aims to improve **transparency, risk monitoring, and regulatory oversight** in offshore rupee derivative markets where many transactions currently remain **unreported**.

National Stock Exchange Gets Securities and Exchange Board of India Nod to Introduce Indian Natural Gas Futures

OTC Fx derivatives contracts reporting may be mandatory

THE RESERVE BANK of India (RBI) on Monday released draft regulations regarding reporting instructions for authorised dealer category-I banks.

Under the proposed guidelines, those banks are required to report over-the-counter (OTC) foreign exchange derivative contracts and foreign currency interest rate derivative contracts, undertaken by them directly or through their overseas entities, to the trade repository of Clearing Corporation of India.

"There is, however, an element of non-transparency because the sizeable number of offshore rupee derivative transactions are not reported and therefore, not available to market participants... Carrying this process of enhancing transparency of rupee derivative markets, it is now proposed that all authorised dealer category - I banks shall report foreign exchange derivative transactions involving rupee undertaken by their related parties globally," the RBI said.

The resultant transparency shall enable better pricing decisions by market participants, it added. OTC derivatives refer to those traded outside the stock exchanges, including on electronic trading platforms, according to the draft.

When reporting, banks must include all key transaction details, such as notional value, counterparty name, maturity date, currency, and other specifications, the RBI said. The regulator mandated that transactions should be reported preferably on the transaction date, but no later than two working days after.

The RBI has given the option to not to report if the contract's notional value is \$1 million or equivalent.

- **Futures** will enable **effective hedging** against **price volatility** and support **long-term planning** for market participants.
- The launch reinforces **India's strategy** to develop a **market-based mechanism** for natural gas pricing and availability.

NSE gets SEBI nod for natural gas futures

Heralding the institution of a market-based mechanism for price discovery and the availability of natural gas in the country, the National Stock Exchange of India (NSE) said on Monday it had received approval from the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) to launch Indian Natural Gas futures.

The NSE Indian Natural Gas futures would be monthly contracts. Additionally, at any point of time, there would be 12 monthly contracts available for trading.

The exchange also informed that further details on contract designs and launch timelines would be "announced in due course".

On January 8, NSE had first announced the strategic collaboration with the Indian Gas Exchange (IGX) to develop and set up Indian Natural Gas futures. It would seek to combine NSE's market infrastructures in the derivatives space and IGX's mechanism for spot trading of natural gas.

The introduction of the natural gas futures is expected to benefit gas producers, city gas distributors, power generators, fertiliser manufacturers, industrial consumers, traders and financial participants by "enabling effective hedging against price volatility and improving long-term planning", the NSE said.

Reserve Bank of India revises External Commercial Borrowings rules, allows companies to raise up to \$1 billion

- The **Reserve Bank of India (RBI)** released the **final guidelines** on **External Commercial Borrowings (ECBs)**, aiming to **rationalise fundraising** through the route.
- Under the new guidelines, companies can raise **ECBs up to \$1 billion or 300% of net worth**, whichever is higher, compared to the previous **\$750-million annual cap**.
- **Eligible borrowers** must raise ECBs with a **minimum average maturity of three years**.
- **Manufacturing sector borrowers** can raise ECBs with a **1-3 year average maturity**, provided the outstanding amount does not exceed **\$150 million**.
- The **cost of borrowing** through ECBs should be **market-determined**, with **fixed-rate loans** linked to **floating rate plus spread** capped at the ceiling.

THE RESERVE BANK OF India (RBI) on Monday relaxed the long-pending on external commercial borrowings (ECBs), allowing companies to raise up to \$1 billion through the route.

The amended regulations have relaxed the ECB framework by expanding eligible borrowers and increased the limit to \$1 billion, up from \$750 million. It also allows companies to raise ECBs with a maturity of up to three years, up from one year.

- **RBI expanded the borrower and lender base**, allowing any entity, including **firms under restructuring or investigation**, to raise funds through ECBs.
- **Proceeds of ECBs** can be utilised in **deposits or other debt instruments** with maturity **up to one year**.
- **End-use restrictions** apply: ECB funds **cannot be used for chit funds, Nidhi companies, real estate, construction of farmhouses, or stock market investments**.
- The guidelines aim to **simplify reporting, rationalise borrowing limits**, and **remove restrictions on cost of borrowing**, promoting **greater flexibility** in overseas fundraising.

India's Wholesale Price Index inflation climbs to 1.81% in January 2026, marking a 10-month high

- **India's Wholesale Price Index (WPI) inflation** rose to a **10-month high of 1.81% (YoY) in January 2026**, up from **0.83% in December 2025**.
- The **rise in WPI** was driven by **higher prices of basic metals, manufactured goods, food items, textiles, and non-food articles**.
- **DPIIT** releases the **index number of wholesale prices in India** on a **monthly basis on 14th of every month** (or next working day if 14th is a holiday), with a **time lag of two weeks** of the reference month.
- In the **WPI basket**, **Manufactured Products** carry the **highest weight (64.23%)**, followed by **Primary Articles (22.62%)** and **Fuel & Power (13.15%)**.

16th Finance Commission boosts Urban Local Government grants by 230% to ₹3.56 trillion

- The **16th Finance Commission (2025–30)** has increased **grants to Urban Local Governments (ULGs)** by **230%**, allocating **₹3.56 trillion**, up from ₹1.55 trillion under the 15th FC.
- The share of grants to **ULGs** has risen to a **record 45%**, compared to 36% in the previous Finance Commission period.
- The **16th Finance Commission** has retained **41% vertical devolution** while introducing **GDP contribution** as a new criterion for horizontal distribution.



- The **Finance Commission** is a **constitutional body** under **Article 280** that strengthens India's **fiscal federalism**.
- The **Finance Commission** is constituted by the **President of India** every **five years**.
- **Shri Arvind Panagariya**, former Vice-Chairman of NITI Aayog, is the **Chairman** of the **16th Finance Commission**.

India's Unemployment Rate Rises to 5% in January 2026 – Periodic Labour Force Survey

- India's **unemployment rate** increased to **5% in January 2026**, marking a **three-month high**, as per the **Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS)** released by the **National Statistics Office (NSO)**.
- The data is based on the **Current Weekly Status (CWS)** methodology.
- **Urban unemployment rate: 7%** (increased from **6.7% in December 2025**).
- **Rural unemployment rate: 4.2%**, reflecting a three-month high.
- The rise indicates **seasonal weakness in rural labour markets** and a **post-harvest slowdown**.
- Labour force participation rate also softened, indicating fewer individuals actively seeking work.
- The increase in rural unemployment is attributed to:
 - **Post-harvest slowdown** reducing agricultural activities
 - **Seasonal decline in temporary farm jobs**
 - Temporary exit of individuals from the labour force
- Under **Current Weekly Status (CWS)**:
 - A person is considered employed if he/she worked for **at least one hour in the previous seven days**.
 - A person is classified as unemployed if he/she **did not work even one hour but was available or seeking work** during that week.
- The 5% unemployment rate remains moderate by global standards but signals:
 - **Short-term rural job contraction**
 - Mild pressure in **urban job markets**
 - Need for continued **employment generation measures**
- The **Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS)** was introduced in **2017**, replacing earlier quinquennial employment surveys.
- PLFS provides:
 - **Monthly estimates for urban areas**
 - **Quarterly rural-urban combined data**
 - Annual employment and unemployment estimates

Prime Minister Narendra Modi Inaugurates Kumar Bhaskar Varma Setu and Northeast's First Emergency Landing Facility in Assam

- **Prime Minister Narendra Modi** inaugurated major infrastructure projects in **Assam** worth over **₹5,450 crore**, aimed at boosting connectivity and strategic preparedness in the Northeast.
- The projects include the **Kumar Bhaskar Varma Setu** over the **Brahmaputra River** in Guwahati and the Northeast's first **Highway Emergency Landing Facility (ELF)** in Dibrugarh district.
- **Kumar Bhaskar Varma Setu** is a **2.86 km-long, six-lane extradosed Prestressed Concrete (PSC) bridge** built at a cost of approximately **₹3,030 crore**.
- It connects **Guwahati** with **North Guwahati** and is the **first extradosed bridge in Northeast India**.
- The bridge reduces travel time between the two sides of the city to **seven minutes**.
- It improves access to major landmarks, including the **Kamakhya Temple**.
- Advanced engineering features include:
 - **Base isolation technology** using friction pendulum bearings
 - High-performance stay cables
 - **Bridge Health Monitoring System (BHMS)** for real-time structural monitoring
- The **Northeast's first Highway Emergency Landing Facility (ELF)** was inaugurated on the **Moran Bypass** in **Dibrugarh district**.
- The ELF has been developed in coordination with the **Indian Air Force (IAF)** as a dual-use infrastructure for both military and civilian aircraft during emergencies.
- After inauguration, **Sukhoi Su-30MKI** and **Dassault Rafale** fighter jets conducted successful take-offs and landings on the highway stretch.
- The ELF is a **4.2 km-long reinforced concrete highway stretch** designed to function as an emergency runway.
- It can handle:
 - Fighter aircraft up to **40 tonnes**
 - Transport aircraft up to **74 tonnes maximum take-off weight**



- The stretch has **no central divider**, and fencing along with removal of temporary structures ensures operational readiness.
- Located in **Upper Assam**, near the **India-China border**, the facility strengthens India's strategic and defence preparedness.
- The ELF provides an alternative landing option if **Dibrugarh Airport** or **Chabua Air Force Station** becomes unavailable.

Union Cabinet Approves ₹10,000 Crore Startup India Fund of Funds 2.0

- The **Union Cabinet**, chaired by **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**, approved the **Startup India Fund of Funds 2.0 (FoF 2.0)** with a **₹10,000 crore corpus**.
- The scheme aims to mobilise **venture capital** for India's startup ecosystem, particularly in **deep tech, innovative manufacturing, and early-growth sectors**.
- The initiative seeks to strengthen India's **domestic venture capital ecosystem** and accelerate innovation-led economic growth.
- Startup India Fund of Funds 2.0 is a government-backed initiative that channels capital into startups through **Alternative Investment Funds (AIFs)**.
- The Government does not invest directly in startups; instead, it invests in AIFs, which further invest in startups.
- The model aims to:
 - Expand venture capital availability
 - Crowd in private investment
 - Strengthen domestic venture capital funds
 - Reduce funding gaps in high-risk sectors
- The scheme builds upon the success of the **Fund of Funds for Startups (FFS 1.0)** launched in 2016.
- FoF 2.0 focuses on **Deep Tech and Innovative Manufacturing**, prioritising sectors such as:
 - Artificial Intelligence
 - Robotics
 - Semiconductor design
 - Clean energy
 - Advanced manufacturing
- The scheme provides support for **early-growth stage startups**, addressing funding gaps that often lead to early-stage failure.

 - Startups have increased from fewer than **500 in 2016**
 - To over **2 lakh Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT)-recognised startups**
 - **2025 recorded the highest annual startup registrations**

Cabinet Approves PM RAHAT Scheme to Ensure Cashless Treatment for Road Accident Victims

- The **Union Cabinet**, chaired by **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**, approved the launch of **PM RAHAT (Road Accident Victim Hospitalization and Assured Treatment)**.
- The scheme ensures that **no road accident victim is denied life-saving treatment due to lack of money**.
- Under PM RAHAT, eligible victims will receive **cashless treatment up to ₹1.5 lakh per person**.
- Coverage is available for **7 days from the date of accident**.
- The scheme strengthens India's **emergency healthcare system** and promotes timely trauma care.
- India records a high number of road accident fatalities annually, and nearly **50% of deaths can be prevented** if treatment is provided within the **Golden Hour**.
- The scheme ensures:
 - Immediate hospital admission
 - Financial certainty for hospitals
 - Structured emergency coordination
 - Protection for vulnerable citizens
- Key features of PM RAHAT:
 - **₹1.5 lakh cashless treatment per victim**
 - Coverage for **7 days**
 - Stabilization treatment up to **24 hours (non-life-threatening cases)**
 - Stabilization treatment up to **48 hours (life-threatening cases)**
 - Police authentication through digital system
 - Applicable on **any category of road**
- The scheme is integrated with the **Emergency Response Support System (ERSS) 112 helpline**, allowing victims, Good Samaritans (Rah-Veer), or bystanders to dial **112** for ambulance support and nearest designated hospital details.
- PM RAHAT is digitally integrated with:
 - **Ministry of Road Transport and Highways Electronic Detailed Accident**

- This ensures seamless coordination from accident reporting to hospital admission, police authentication, treatment, and payment settlement.
- Reimbursement will be made through the **Motor Vehicle Accident Fund (MVAFF)**.
- If the offending vehicle is insured, payment will be made by **General Insurance Companies**.
- In **uninsured or Hit and Run cases**, payment will be made through **Government of India budget allocation**.
- Claims approved by the **State Health Agency** will be settled within **10 days**, ensuring financial certainty for hospitals.
- Grievances will be handled by a **Grievance Redressal Officer** nominated by the **District Road Safety Committee**.
- The District Road Safety Committee is chaired by the **District Collector/District Magistrate/Deputy Commissioner**.
- Police confirmation timelines are fixed at:
 - **24 hours for non-life-threatening cases**
 - **48 hours for life-threatening cases**

Union Cabinet Approves ₹1 Lakh Crore Urban Challenge Fund (UCF) to Transform Urban Infrastructure

- The **Union Cabinet**, chaired by **Prime Minister Narendra Modi**, approved a **₹1 lakh crore Urban Challenge Fund (UCF)** to strengthen urban infrastructure.
- The scheme aims to shift India's urban development model from **grant-based funding to market-linked and reform-driven growth**.
- The fund is expected to mobilise **₹4 lakh crore investment** over five years with mandatory private participation and competitive project selection.
- The **Urban Challenge Fund (UCF)** is a **Centrally Sponsored Scheme** providing **₹1 lakh crore as Central Assistance (CA)**.
- The Centre will fund **25% of project cost**, while a minimum of **50% must be raised through market sources** such as municipal bonds, bank loans, and **Public-Private Partnerships (PPPs)**.
- The remaining contribution will be borne by **States, Urban Local Bodies (ULBs), or other sources**.

Om Birla to Represent India at Bangladesh PM Tarique Rahman's Swearing-In Ceremony

- **Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla** represented India at the **oath-taking ceremony** of Bangladesh's newly elected government in **Dhaka** on **February 17, 2026**.
- The new government is led by **Tarique Rahman**, Chairman of the **Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP)**.
- The **BNP** secured a **landslide victory** in the **February 2026 general elections**, winning over **200 seats** (212 seats for the BNP-led alliance), marking a democratic transition of power.
- The **Chief Adviser** of the interim government, **Muhammad Yunus**, invited heads of government from **13 countries**, including **India, China, Saudi Arabia, Pakistan, Turkey, UAE, Qatar, Malaysia, Brunei, Sri Lanka, Nepal, Maldives, and Bhutan**.
- Prime Minister **Narendra Modi** was invited but could not attend due to prior commitments (meeting French President Emmanuel Macron) in **Mumbai**.
- The **oath of office** for **Tarique Rahman** was administered by **President Mohammed Shahabuddin** (while the **Chief Election Commissioner** oversaw the earlier oath for MPs), signifying a constitutional transition.
- The ceremony took place at the **Southern Plaza** of the **Bangladesh Parliament House (Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban)**.
- **Tarique Rahman** succeeds an **interim government** that had governed since the student-led uprising ended **Sheikh Hasina's rule** in **August 2024**.
- **BNP chief Rahman** returned from **17 years of exile** in Britain in **December 2025**, marking a significant political comeback.
- The **BNP alliance** won **212 seats**, while the **Jamaat-e-Islami-led alliance** secured **77 seats**, according to the **Election Commission**.

Rocket debris bearing Indian Space Research Organisation logo discovered near uninhabited island in Maldives

- **Debris bearing the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) logo** and **India's National Emblem** was found on **L. Kunahandhoo island** in the **Maldives** in **December 2025**.
- The debris is believed to be part of the **Payload Fairing** from **ISRO's LVM3 (Launch Vehicle Mark-3)** rocket.
- The **LVM3-M6 mission** on **18 December 2025** successfully launched the **BlueBird Block-2 satellite** for **AST SpaceMobile** from **Sriharikota**.
- The **LVM3** is **India's heaviest rocket**, a **three-stage vehicle** with **solid strap-ons**, a **liquid core stage**, and a **cryogenic upper stage**.
- The **debris washed up** on an **uninhabited island** in the Maldives, causing **no damage** to human life or property.
- **ISRO** has not yet **confirmed** whether the debris belongs to an **Indian launch vehicle**.
- Earlier in **November 2025**, the **LVM3** was also used to launch the **CMS-03 communication satellite**.

Launch vehicle debris with ISRO logo, National Emblem found on Maldives island

The debris from a launch vehicle bearing the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) logo and the National Emblem has reportedly been found recently on an uninhabited island in the Maldives.

The debris of the payload fairing, believed to be from the ISRO's Launch Vehicle Mark-3 (LVM-3), washed up on an island near L. Kunahandhoo in the Maldives and was found on February 12.

A website which tracks Indian spaceflight and aerospace developments said on X that the debris was likely from the LVM-3-M6 mission.

"A PLF (payload fairing) has washed up on an uninhabited island near L. Ku-

nahandhoo, #maldives (found February 12, 2026). The @isro logo's position below the national emblem suggests it is likely from the LVM-3-M6 launch. This follows a similar recovery on December 28, 2025, in Sri Lanka (Trincomalee), which also appeared to be from the same mission," the website

indianspaceflight.in posted on X.

On December 19, 2025, the ISRO launched the LVM-3-M6/BlueBird Block-2 Mission, a dedicated commercial mission aboard the LVM-3 launch vehicle.

During the mission, it successfully launched the BlueBird Block-2 satellite of AST SpaceMobile, U.S., and on November 2 the space agency used the LVM-3 to launch the CMS-03 communication satellite.

The LVM-3 is the heaviest rocket developed by the ISRO and is a three-stage launch vehicle competing two solid strap-on motors, a liquid core stage, and a cryogenic upper stage. The ISRO is yet to confirm whether the debris is from an Indian launch vehicle.

- The **Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO)** has shortlisted **Tata Advanced Systems Ltd (TASL)** and a consortium led by **Larsen & Toubro (L&T)** with **Bharat Forge** for the **prototype design and development** of the **Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA)**.

Zoological Survey of India Scientists Discover New Diplura Species “Lepidocampa sikkimensis” in Eastern Himalayas

- Scientists from the **Zoological Survey of India (ZSI)** have discovered a **new species of Diplura** in the **eastern Himalayas**, named **“Lepidocampa sikkimensis”**, marking a milestone in **Indian entomology**.

Tata, two consortia led by L&T, Bharat Forge shortlisted for making fighter jets**

TATA ADVANCED Systems Ltd as a standalone contender, a consortium of Larsen & Toubro and Bharat Electronics Ltd, and a Bharat Forge-BEML Ltd-Dana Patterns consortium have been shortlisted by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) to design and develop prototypes of the proposed Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA).

The AMCA project is aimed at developing India's home-grown fifth-generation stealth fighter, a single-seat twin-engine jet with advanced stealth coatings and internal weapons bays. It is expected to produce over 125 fighter jets that could be ready for induction into the Air Force by 2035. India would then join a small list of countries with fifth-generation fighters like the US (F-22 and F-35), China (J-20), and Russia (Su-57).

The DRDO, through the Aeronautical Development Agency, had floated tenders in July 2025. Originally seven consortiums, including Adani Defence and HAL, had bid to partner with the DRDO for the AMCA project. The shortlisted bidders are expected to receive funding support from the government to build models of the AMCA, before manufacturing rights are given.

The AMCA project marks India's push to modernise its

- The discovery ends nearly **five decades** of limited research on **Diplura** in India and is the **first species of its kind** formally described by an **Indian research team**.
- The findings were published on **7 January 2026** in the international taxonomic journal “**Zootaxa**”.
- **Diplurans** are **primitive hexapods**, blind, **soil-dwelling micro-arthropods** commonly called **two-pronged bristletails**, belonging to an **ancient evolutionary lineage**.
- Until now, **17 Diplura species** had been recorded in India, all identified by **foreign scientists**, making this discovery a **revival of indigenous taxonomic research**.
- The species was discovered near **Ravangla in Sikkim**, and later confirmed in **Kurseong**, indicating a wider distribution across the **eastern Himalayan region**.
- **Lepidocampa sikkimensis** is distinguished by **unique body scale arrangement**, specific **chaetotaxy pattern** (bristle patterns), and **specialised appendage structures**.
- Documenting **soil biodiversity** is essential for understanding **ecosystem functioning**, as Diplurans contribute to **nutrient cycling** and **soil structure maintenance**.
- The study also rediscovered “**Lepidocampa juratii bengalensis**”, a rare **subspecies** not recorded for nearly **50 years**, and generated **DNA barcode data** for the first time for an Indian Lepidocampa species.

INS Tarangini to Participate in IFR 2026 and MILAN Exercises at Visakhapatnam

- **INS Tarangini**, the Indian Navy’s **sail training ship**, is among the prominent vessels arriving at **Visakhapatnam** for the **International Fleet Review (IFR) 2026** and multinational naval exercise **MILAN**, commencing **February 18, 2026**.
- Around **75 naval vessels** are expected to participate, including **20 foreign warships**, highlighting India’s expanding **naval diplomacy** in the **Indo-Pacific**.
- **INS Tarangini** was **commissioned in 1997** and became the **first Indian naval vessel to circumnavigate the globe in 2003–2004**.
- The ship represented India at the **International Fleet Review** during the **Sri Lankan Navy’s diamond jubilee** in **December 2010**, being the **only tall ship present** and the **first reviewed by the Sri Lankan President**.
- **INS Vikrant**, India’s **first indigenously built aircraft carrier**, will headline **IFR 2026**, symbolising **naval self-reliance** and **blue-water capability**.
- **IFR 2026** provides a platform to showcase **naval strength**, **operational readiness**, and **defence manufacturing achievements**.
- **Foreign naval participation** includes the Philippine Navy’s **BRP Miguel Malvar**, Maldives’ **CGS Huravee**, Seychelles Coast Guard **SCGS Zoroaster (P609)**, and Vietnam People’s Navy frigate **VNPS 17**.



- Participation from **20 foreign navies** reflects India's focus on **cooperative security, interoperability, and maritime partnerships** in the **Indian Ocean Region (IOR)** and **Indo-Pacific**.

Following a 24-year journey, Paras Dogra became the second batter to score 10,000 runs in the Ranji Trophy, when he gathered 21 runs during Jammu and Kashmir's first innings against Bengal in the semifinal at the Bengal Cricket Academy ground here on Monday.

- With this achievement, he became the **second-highest run-scorer** in Ranji Trophy history after Wasim Jaffer.
- The milestone came during **Jammu & Kashmir's first-ever Ranji Trophy semi-final appearance**, adding greater significance to the achievement.
- Paras Dogra made his **first-class debut in the 2001–02 season** and has represented **Himachal Pradesh, Puducherry, and Jammu & Kashmir** in domestic cricket.

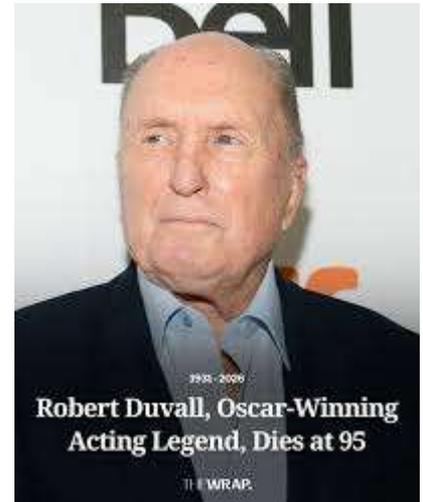
